New Hampshire 2016 General Election
Survey of 609 Likely Voters
Field Dates July 29 – August 1, 2016**

I'm going to read you the names of several people who are active in public affairs. After I read each one please tell me if you have a generally favorable or generally unfavorable view of the person. If you have never heard of the person or if you are undecided, please just say so. **READ FIRST NAME.** How about **READ NEXT NAME?**

REPEAT QUESTION TEXT ONLY IF NECESSARY, PROBE IF RESPONDENT SAYS "DON'T KNOW". Have you heard of **READ NAME** and are undecided about (him/her)? Or **PAUSE** have you never heard of (him/her)?

About the Poll

These results are based on a survey of 609 likely voters in the 2016 General Election in New Hampshire. Live telephone interviews were conducted July 29 – August 1, 2016 via both landline and cell phone using conventional registration based sampling procedures. The margin of sampling error is +/- 4 percentage points with a 95 percent level of confidence. The poll was sponsored by WBUR, a National Public Radio station in the Boston area.
