**Survey of 442 Likely Voters**

I'm going to read you the names of several people who are active in public affairs. After I read each one please tell me if you have a generally favorable or generally unfavorable view of the person. If you have never heard of the person or if you are undecided, please just say so. **READ FIRST NAME.** How about **READ NEXT NAME? REPEAT QUESTION TEXT ONLY IF NECESSARY, PROBE IF RESPONDENT SAYS "DON'T KNOW"**. Have you heard of **READ NAME** and are undecided about (him/her)? Or **PAUSE** have you never heard of (him/her)?

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### About the Poll

These results are based on a survey of 442 likely voters in the 2020 New Hampshire Democratic Primary for President. Live telephone interviews were conducted December 3-8, 2019 via both landline and cell phone using conventional registration based sampling procedures. Results were weighted to known and estimate demographic parameters on party registration, age, gender, race, education, and region. The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 4.7 percentage points with a 95 percent level of confidence. The poll was sponsored by WBUR, a National Public Radio station in the Boston area.
